BAPTISM "Unless you are born again..."

Arrangements can be made with the parish priest. Parents should be registered in our parish. Baptismal classes are held for parents. Call the rectory one week in advance.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY "What God has joined..." Engaged couples should phone the rectory to make an appointment with the parish priest to set the date and time for their wedding at least six months in advance. Attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference is also required.

CARE OF THE SICK "Come to me you who are weary..." Please notify the rectory office for a pastoral visit to any family member who is sick, confined at home, hospitalized or in a nursing home. Arrangements for the reception of sacraments of the Eucharist can be made through the rectory office. Ministers of the sick are available to bring communion to shut-ins on a weekly basis.

ADULT INSTRUCTION AND RCIA "Go and teach all nations.." Adults interested in the Catholic faith are cordially invited to contact the rectory office for information about Adult Inquiry Classes, the Catechumenate, and preparation for adult reception of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (RCIA).

For those who have been asked to be sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation, we gladly issue recommendations for parishioners who: (1) are baptized and confirmed; (2) are at least 16 years old; (3) are registered for at least 6 months; (4) attend Mass regularly; (5) if married, have done so in conformity with the laws of the Church; (6) if they are parents, are sending their children to Catholic School or Religious Instructions; (7) if they are students, are attending Catholic School or Religious Instructions.

FROM THE PASTOR

Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time: Calling the Fathers

Today's Gospel continues to elaborate on the tension between Jesus and the scribes and Pharisees. Our Lectionary sequence at this point, however, is not quite a continuous reading of Matthew. In between last week's reading from Matthew and this week's, we find Jesus' question to the Pharisees about the Messiah being "David's son." Having concluded a series of dialogues with the Pharisees and other religious leaders, Jesus now directs his words to the crowds, warning them not to follow the example of the scribes and Pharisees. Though they were Moses' successors, the Pharisees and scribes exalted themselves, making their mastery of the law a badge of social privilege. Worse, they had lorded the law over the people. Like the priests Malachi condemns in today's First Reading, they caused many to falter and be closed off from God. In a word, Israel's leaders failed to be good spiritual fathers of God's people. Moses was a humble father figure, preaching the law but also practicing it; interceding and begging God's mercy and forgiveness of the people's sins.

Jesus reminds us today that all fatherhood, in the family or in the people of God, comes from the Father in heaven. He doesn't mean we're to literally call no man "father." He Himself referred to Israel's founding fathers; the Apostles taught about natural fatherhood and described themselves as spiritual fathers.

The fatherhood of the Apostles and their successors, the Church's priests and bishops is a spiritual paternity given to raise us as God's children. Our fathers give us new life in Baptism and feed us the spiritual milk of the Gospel and the Eucharist. That's why Paul, in today's Second Reading, can also compare himself to a nursing mother.

God's fatherhood likewise transcends all human notions of fatherhood and motherhood. Perhaps that's why the Psalm chosen for today includes one of the rare biblical images of God's maternal care. His only Son has shown us the Father coming to gather His children as a hen gathers her young. We're all brothers and sisters, our Lord tells us today. And all of us, even our spiritual fathers, are to trust in Him, humbly, like children on our mothers' laps.

My ardent desire is to humbly preach the law and practice it; May our prayer be to walk in God's Way as His children. Choicest Blessings, Fr. Tim

We will see shortly a united bulletin for all. An inclusive structuring of the family to help us minister to and care for our new and renewed members more efficiently. I humbly request your continued prayer and patience, as we endeavor to listen to and love all as we journey forward together.
