SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY "What God has joined..." Engaged couples should phone the rectory to make an appointment with the parish priest to set the date and time for their wedding at least six months in advance. Attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference is also required.

CARE OF THE SICK "Come to me you who are weary..." Please notify the rectory office for a pastoral visit to any family member who is sick, confined at home, hospitalized or in a nursing home. Arrangements for the reception of sacraments of the Eucharist can be made through the rectory office. Ministers of the sick are available to bring communion to shut-ins on a weekly basis.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the sick is administered each First Thursday after the 7:00 PM Mass and upon request.

ADULT INSTRUCTION AND RCIA "Go and teach all nations.." Adults interested in the Catholic faith are cordially invited to contact the rectory office for information about Adult Inquiry Classes, the Catechumenate, and preparation for adult reception of the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (RCIA).

For those who have been asked to be sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation, we gladly issue recommendations for parishioners who: (1) are baptized and confirmed; (2) are at least 16 years old; (3) are registered for at least 6 months; (4) attend Mass regularly; (5) if married, have done so in conformity with the laws of the Church; (6) if they are parents, are sending their children to Catholic School or Religious Instructions; (7) if they are students, are attending Catholic School or Religious Instructions.

Seventh Sunday of Easter: Knowing God

Today's Gospel is a prayer, which appears at the conclusion of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. At the end of the prayer, Jesus is arrested in the garden. The prayer might be read as Jesus' final commendation of himself to the Father. In the prayer, Jesus also expresses care and concern for his disciples. Jesus' prayer reaffirms the complete union between Jesus and the Father. Throughout John's Gospel, Jesus has been presented as the Word, who pre-existed with the Father and was sent to do the Father's work on earth. In this prayer we learn that Jesus' life and ministry have been directed toward one purpose, revealing

Jesus has been taken up into heaven as we begin today's First Reading. His disciples, including the Apostles and Mary, return to the upper room where He celebrated the Last Supper. There, they devote themselves with one accord to prayer, awaiting the Spirit that He promised would come upon them.

The unity of the early Church at Jerusalem is a sign of the oneness that Christ prays for in today's Gospel. The Church is to be a communion on earth that mirrors the glorious union of Father, Son, and Spirit in the Trinity. Jesus has proclaimed God's name to His brethren. The prophets had foretold this revelation: a new covenant by which all flesh would have knowledge of the Lord.

By the new covenant made in His blood and remembered in every Eucharist we know God as our Father. This is the eternal life Jesus promises. And this is the light and salvation we sing of in today's Psalm. As God made light to shine out of darkness when the world began, He has enlightened us in Baptism, making us new creations, giving us knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

Our new life is a gift of "the Spirit of glory," we hear in today's Second Reading. Made one in His name, we are given a new name, "Christians," a name used only here and in two other places in the Bible. We are to glorify God, though we will be insulted and suffer because of this name. But as we share in His sufferings, we know we will overcome and rejoice when His glory is once more revealed. And we will dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of our lives. Choicest Blessings, Fr. Tim

Road to Renewal Update:

The Greek philosopher Socrates wrote, "The secret of change is to focus all of your energy not on fighting the old, but on building the new." Could this apply to you? I know it applies to me and I think this is applicable during our Road to Renewal process. We are in the most nebulous and even confusing time of our process, we should be gathering the "old" and looking at what we have done and are doing as a Parish. This brings up a reminder of the last thirty years where we became use to having one priest per parish. He offered: guidance, stability, continuity, familiarity and even autonomy. The Road to Renewal is designed to accommodate a drastic reduction in priests in seven years and to help us refocus on our mission to re-evangelize ourselves and to evangelize our world and time to come. This new model expands our vision and support system. The Pillar Groups are designed to give all a chance to contribute, question and learn.

September 10th will be our Institution date as a family, we will have an action plan and way ahead as family at that time. We will be functioning fully as a family by then. Now we endeavor to maintain what each of us has while we seek to support each other. At present we have Fr. Ross, Fr. Johnson, Deacon Bill and I, assigned and dedicated to the pastoral needs and concerns of all. We are anticipating the assignment of a third parochial vicar and possibly two more Deacons. At present we are very thankful for the Franciscans from St. Francis. the retired priests who have been serving our Parishes for a number of years, and especially Fr. Jim Fliss who is helping us directly through the process. I pray that the Holy Spirit opens us up to this new model and continues to guide us moving forward. Please continue to call your parish office with any needs; they will be given no less attention and maybe more as we progress. Thank you for your patience with me as I learn along with you what the future has in store. Please continue to pray for the renewal and help us build on the new. Choicest Blessings, Fr. Tim
