Arrangements for the reception of sacraments of the Eucharist can be made through the rectory office. Ministers of the sick are available to bring communion to shut-ins on a weekly basis.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the sick is administered each First Thursday after the 7:00 PM Mass and upon request.

FROM THE PASTOR

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: Kingdom of Priests

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The words God speaks to Israel in today's First Reading are intended for us as well. The Church is the fulfillment of God's covenant promises to Israel, a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.

In the Church, we have been gathered as the new “Israel of God.” He has made us His own people, the flock He tends, as we sing in today's Psalm. Moses was Israel's first shepherd. With the Promised Land in view, he prayed that God would raise up a successor so that God's people would not be left as sheep without a shepherd.

These same words are used in today's Gospel to describe Jesus' pity for the crowds, who are “troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.” Israel's shepherds, the Pharisees and scribes, had abandoned and misled the people through their hypocrisy and spiritual blindness. But God had long before promised that He Himself would come and save His sheep, searching over the whole earth where they had been scattered “for lack of a shepherd.”

Jesus is the new Moses and new David promised by the prophets, a divine shepherd-king sent to restore God's priestly kingdom. As Moses commissioned Joshua as his successor, so we see Jesus today giving the Twelve His powers and authority. In God's plan, they are to seek out the lost sheep of Israel first and then bring all nations into the fold.

Together we have been saved and reconciled to God, as we hear in today's Second Reading. As He delivered Israel, He has also made us a kingdom of priests in the Church.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission. So we come in this Mass to serve Him with gladness, to praise His kindness, which endures forever.

Saint Dominic Savio said, “I am not capable of doing big things, but I want to do everything, even the smallest things, for the greater glory of God.” I believe this is how a lot of us feel about the renewal. It is a very daunting task, almost impossible. We must remind ourselves that even the smallest task, a prayer for the renewal, will be for the greater glory of God our loving Father. Thank you for your involvement.
