For those who have been asked to be sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation, we gladly issue recommendations for parishioners who: (1) are baptized and confirmed; (2) are at least 16 years old; (3) are registered for at least 6 months; (4) attend Mass regularly; (5) if married, have done so in conformity with the laws of the Church; (6) if they are parents, are sending their children to Catholic School or Religious Instructions; (7) if they are students, are attending Catholic School or Religious Instructions.

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** "What God has joined..."

Engaged couples should phone the rectory to make an appointment with the parish priest to set the date and time for their wedding at least six months in advance. Attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference is also required.

**PARISH MEMBERSHIP** "That they may all be one..."

We always welcome new members to our parish family. Please contact the parish priest or the rectory.

**CARE OF THE SICK** "Come to me you who are weary..." Please notify the rectory office for a pastoral visit to any family member who is sick, confined at home, hospitalized or in a nursing home. Arrangements for the reception of sacraments of the Eucharist can be made through the rectory office. Ministers of the sick are available to bring communion to shut-ins on a weekly basis.

### FROM THE PASTOR

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Of Wheat and Weeds

In today’s Gospel, Jesus offers three parables to describe the Kingdom of Heaven. This reading is a continuation of Jesus’ discourse that we began reading last Sunday. Contained within these parables are words of caution as well as words of consolation. In the parable of the sower we are warned against judging others. To judge and uproot the “weeds” prematurely will harm the wheat; final judgment rests with God. In the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, we are consoled by the message that God can work wonders and produce abundance from even the smallest beginnings of the Kingdom of Heaven.

God is always teaching His people, as we hear in today’s First Reading. And what does He want us to know? That He has care for all of us; that though He is a God of justice, even those who defy and disbelieve Him may hope for His mercy if they turn to Him in repentance. This divine teaching continues in the three parables that Jesus tells in the Gospel today. Each describes the emergence of the kingdom of God from the seeds sown by His works and preaching. The kingdom’s growth is hidden like the working of yeast in bread; it’s improbable, unexpected, as in the way the tall mustard tree grows from the smallest of seeds.

Again, this week’s readings sound a note of questioning: Why does God permit the evil to grow alongside the good? Why does He permit some to reject the Word of His kingdom? Because, as we sing in today’s Psalm, God is slow to anger and abounding in kindness. He is just, Jesus assures us, evildoers and those who cause others to sin, will be thrown into the fiery furnace at the end of the age. But by His patience God is teaching us that above all He desires repentance and the gathering of all nations to worship Him and to glorify His name.

Even though we don’t know how to pray as we ought, the Spirit will intercede for us, Paul promises in today’s Second Reading. But first, we must turn and call upon Him. We must commit ourselves to letting the good seed of His Word bear fruit in our lives. So, we should not be deceived or lose heart when we see weeds among the wheat; truth and holiness mixed with error, injustice, and sin.

For now, He makes His sun rise on the good and the bad. But the harvest draws near. Let’s work so that we might be numbered among the righteous children; who will shine like the sun in the kingdom of the Father. Committed to our being righteous, let us always humbly recognize our need for God’s mercy and mirror that humility to all we encounter.

### Road to Renewal

As part of the road to renewal, new parish initiatives are going to be introduced to help us evangelize to the people in our family and communities. One of those new programs is called Alpha. Alpha is an 11-week course that creates a space where people are excited to bring their friends for a conversation about Jesus. Alpha estimated that in 2021 alone, more than 4,000 Catholic parishes and organizations globally ran Alpha reaching an estimated 279,238 participants. This program will give us an opportunity to reach new people as well as invite back those who have fallen away from their relationship with Christ. Saint Ursula Julia Ledochowska said, “Holiness does not demand anything great, beyond the ability of the person. It depends on God’s Love; every daily act can be transformed into an act of love.” If we all invited one person who we know who does not have a relationship with Christ to Mass or even to our Alpha program, we can help God’s love spread throughout our community and local Church. Helping each and every one of us grow in holiness.

I have expressed before how change can be difficult for us. However, as a wise woman once told me, “in the absence of change, rigor mortis sets in.” The Catholic Church, the living body of our Lord cannot and will not settle for rigor mortis.
