This Week's Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

The Sadducees in Sunday's Gospel challenge Jesus to take a stand on resurrection, a notion they did not accept. They cited a law that required a man to marry his brother's widow in order to preserve the brother's name. The law assumed a physical notion of living on through one's children. Jesus argues, "God is God of the living." He quotes God's words to Moses, "I am the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob" (Exodus 3:15) to emphasize that these people are alive to God. God is God of all who have lived as well as all people living now. The lesson here is to trust the future to the God who has given all life and who raised Jesus from the dead. Promise (Pre School, K, 1): All God's creatures have homes and God has a special home for us in Heaven. Display the last page of the Gospel Weekly that you child brought home for this week (November 10th) so they can will see it every day.

Good News (Grades 2-3): This week's lesson gives you an opportunity to talk about people who have died. Share ways your family can show its appreciation for the gift of life. Your child also has learned about the First, Second, and Third Commandments. Take time to review them with your child.

Venture (Grades 4-6): Your child's Gospel Weekly this week teaches about how belief in the resurrection of the dead grew in Jewish tradition. Talk about resurrection and what it means to you. Share with your family your own faith in resurrection. Share some of the ways your family is aware of the importance of that journey.
